READY, SET, GO

Possibly the worst part about moving to a new home is packing and unpacking... but what if I told you that this is a thing of the past? Well, at least it is at The Parker (theparkerboston.com), developed by Fortis Property Group. Thanks to Linda Zarifi, the interior designer on the project, future residents of the luxury building can opt to move into their condos without the hassle due to Boston's very first (and limited-edition) furniture package. "The real question that we always tried to ask ourselves is how do we create this transformative environment? And we do it by having a strong concept. We do it by having a strong design that supports that concept. And really, we try to hit on it every step of the way," Zarifi says. Inspired by the lack of supply chain that she faced during the project due to COVID-19, the interior designer wanted to offer a five-star luxury service that mimicked the same high-design approach of the rest of the building that attracted the buyers to

begin with. And the steps are simple: View the model unit, get a feel for the style and furniture, and purchase the package in the sales center. "When you're ready to move in,

you just come and you open up the door and everything, minus personal items, is really there," she explains, noting that the lead time for furniture delivery is about 12 to 16 weeks.

Homeowners can expect a variety of bespoke furniture names from distant lands like Thailand, Europe and the Netherlands, as well as some local New England artists. ■

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
